

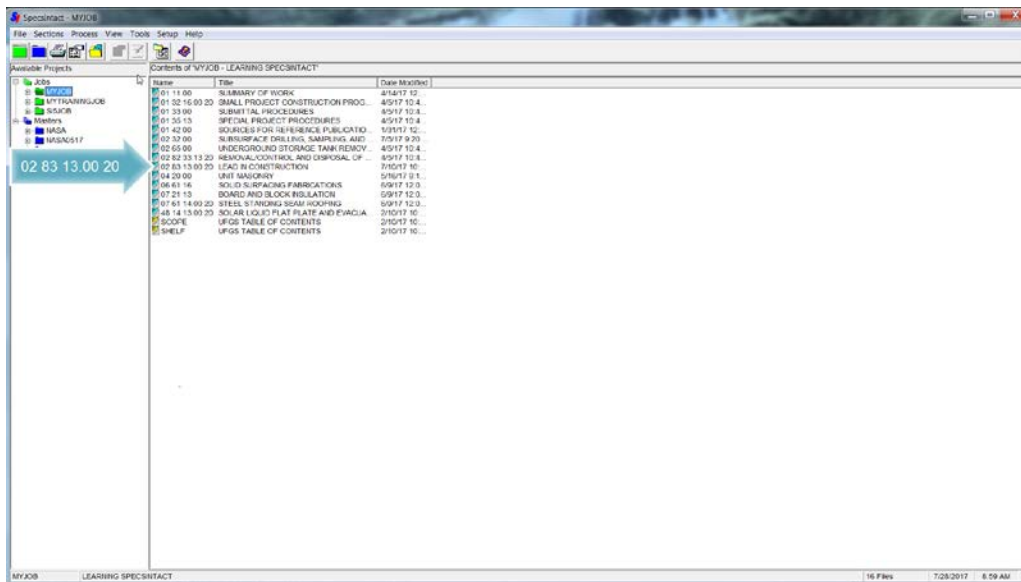

Module: Chapter 3 - Editing Text, Lists, and Items

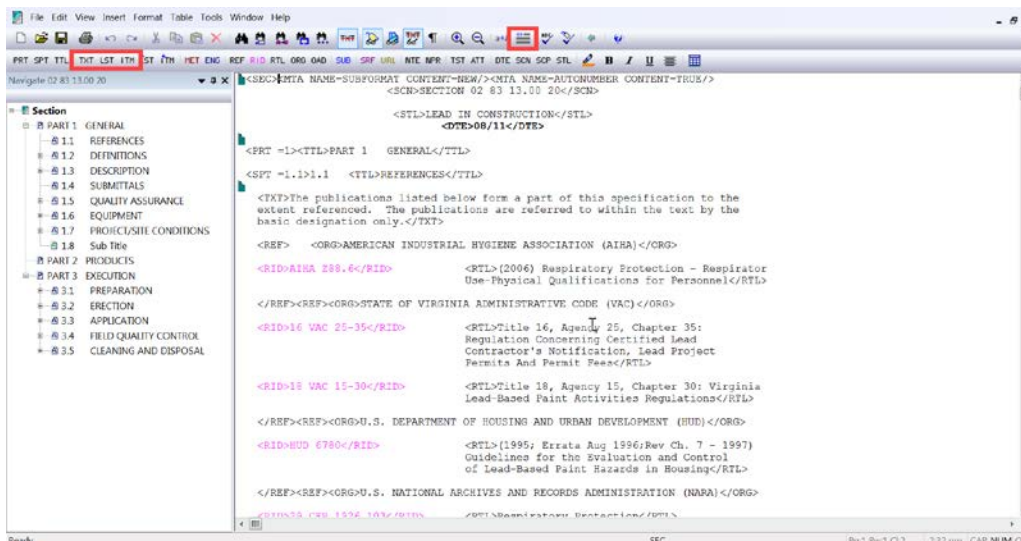

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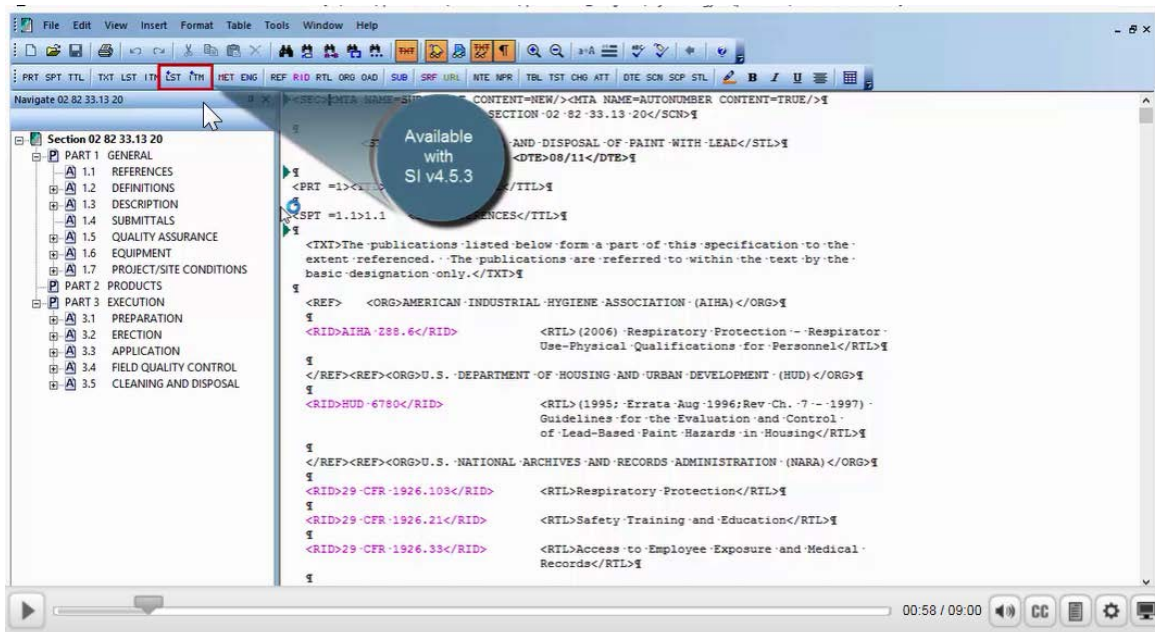
Now that you have learned the necessary techniques for editing subparts, let's learn to properly edit other elements such as Text, Lists, and Items that are used throughout your specification. Let's open Section 02 82 33.13 20.



Before we start working with the new elements, I would like to provide a few tips that you may not be aware of, on the Tagsbar the TXT, LST, and ITM buttons appear in the order in which they will indent. The Toggle Indentation button located on the Toolbar will change the <LST> and <ITM> tags to a LST or ITM Indent tag with a -0.33 indentation.

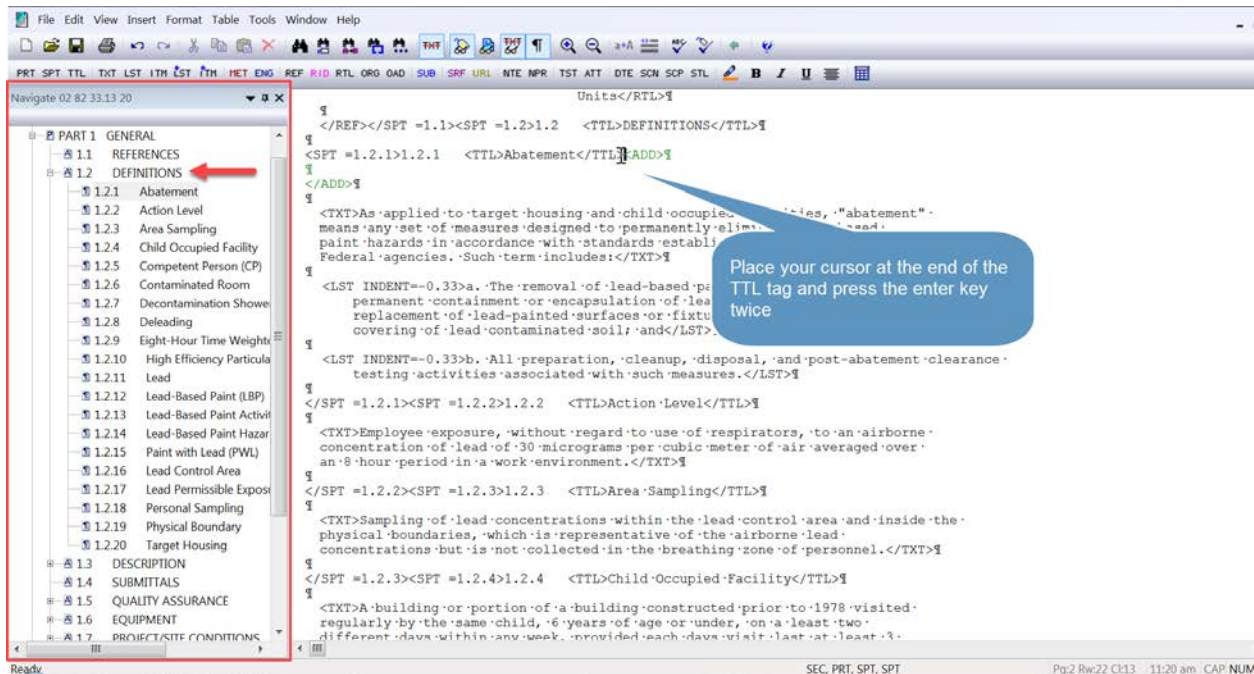


As you see the new SI Editor has added two new buttons to the Tagsbar, a LST Indent, and an ITM Indent, which will minimize the steps when adding these elements.

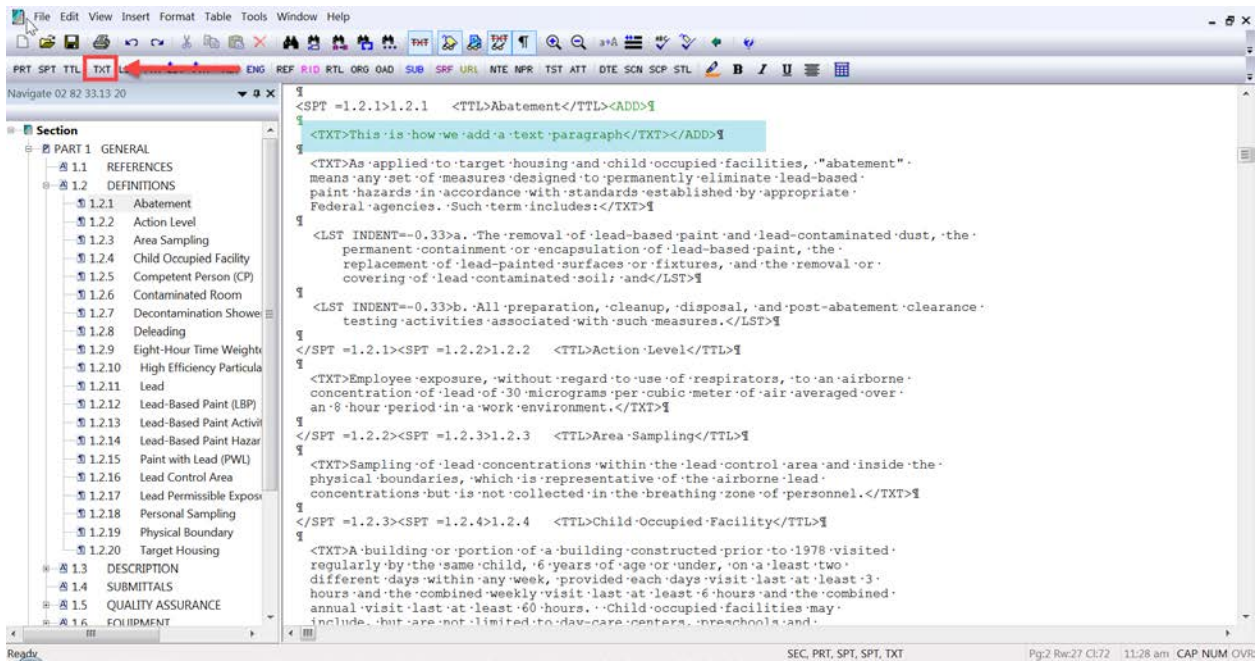

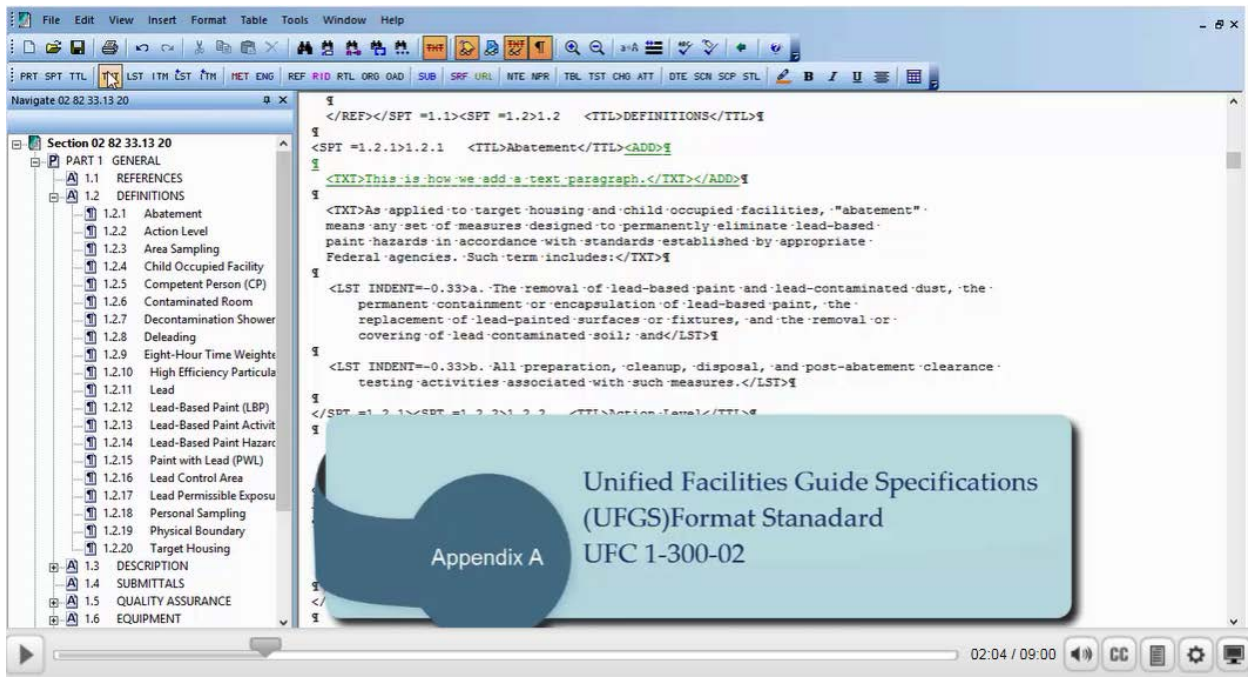
Now that we are familiar with the Toolbar buttons used for inserting and modifying the TXT, LST, and ITM tags, the best way to see how these elements work is by doing them yourself. Let's *navigate* to 1.2 DEFINITIONS so we can add a TXT paragraph. We are going to place our cursor to the right of the ending </TTL> tag for 1.2.1 Abatement and *press the enter key twice*. Since we are using Revisions, a set of ADD tags will appear.



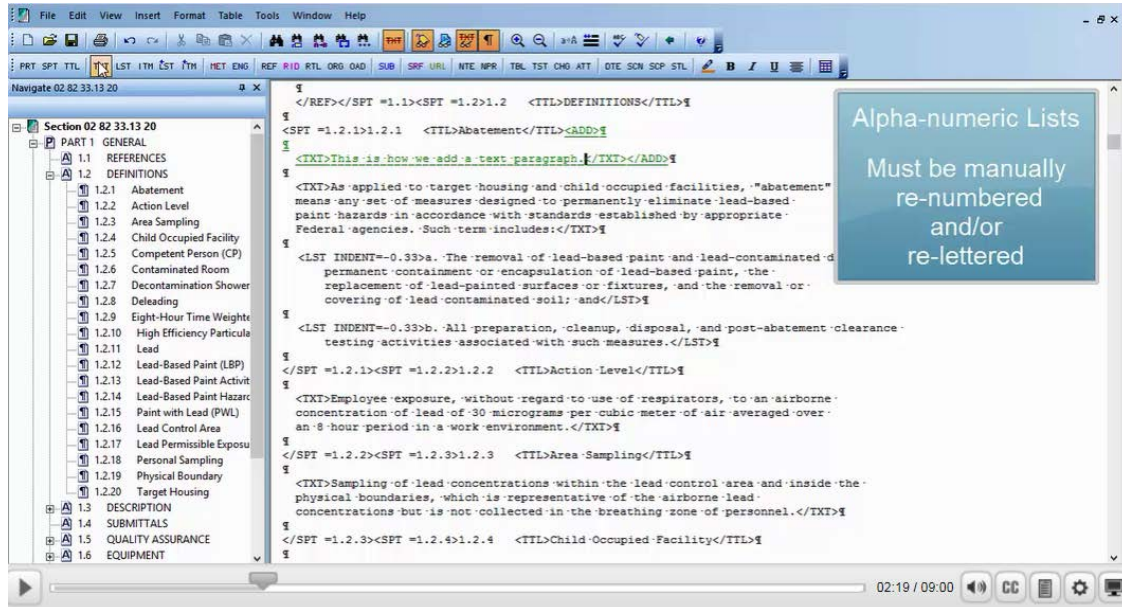
Let's select the **TXT** button on the Tagsbar and type "This is how we add a text paragraph."



LST and ITM elements can be used below the paragraph or subparagraph level with an alternating alpha-numeric designation. You may refer to the Unified Facilities Guide Specifications (UFGS) Format Standard UFC 1-300-02, Appendix A for more detailed information.

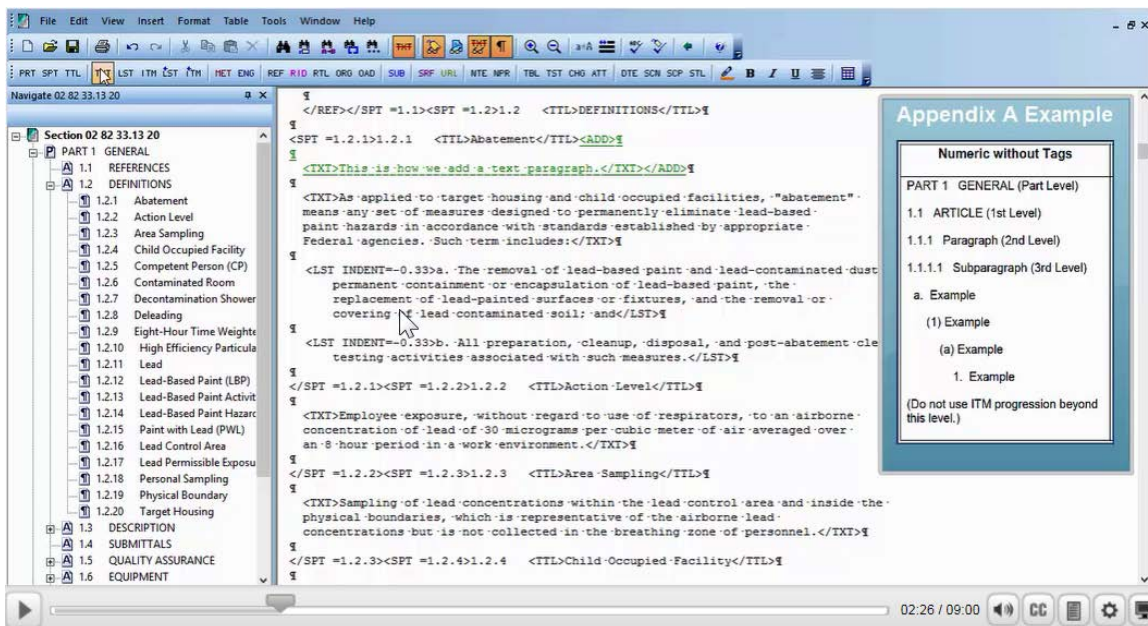


When using these elements, keep in mind that this format will not automatically renumber or correctly translate to the Alphanumeric format.

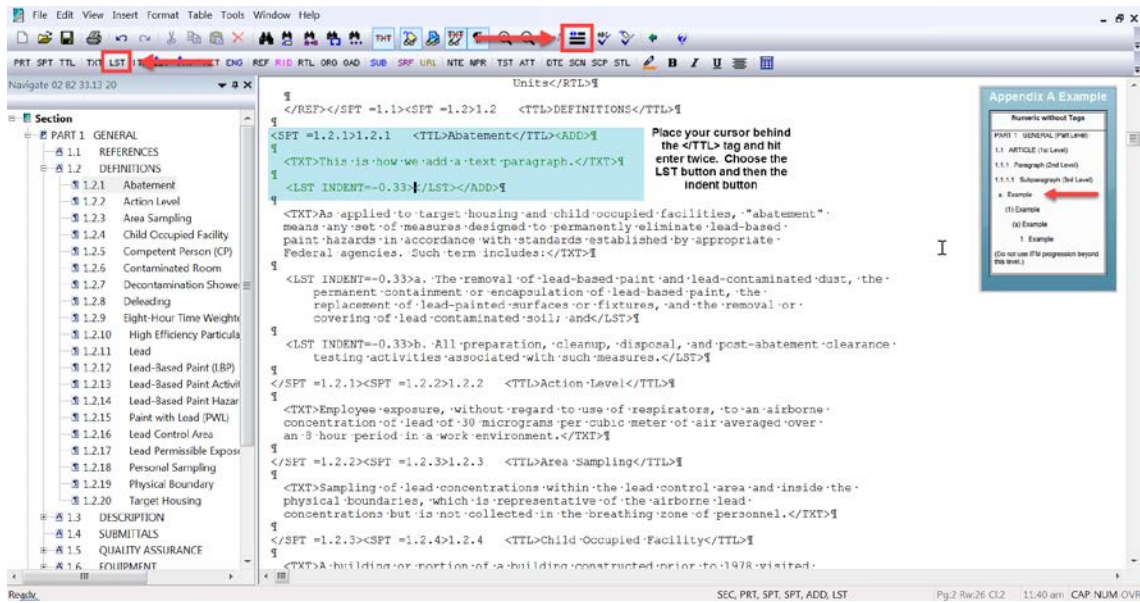

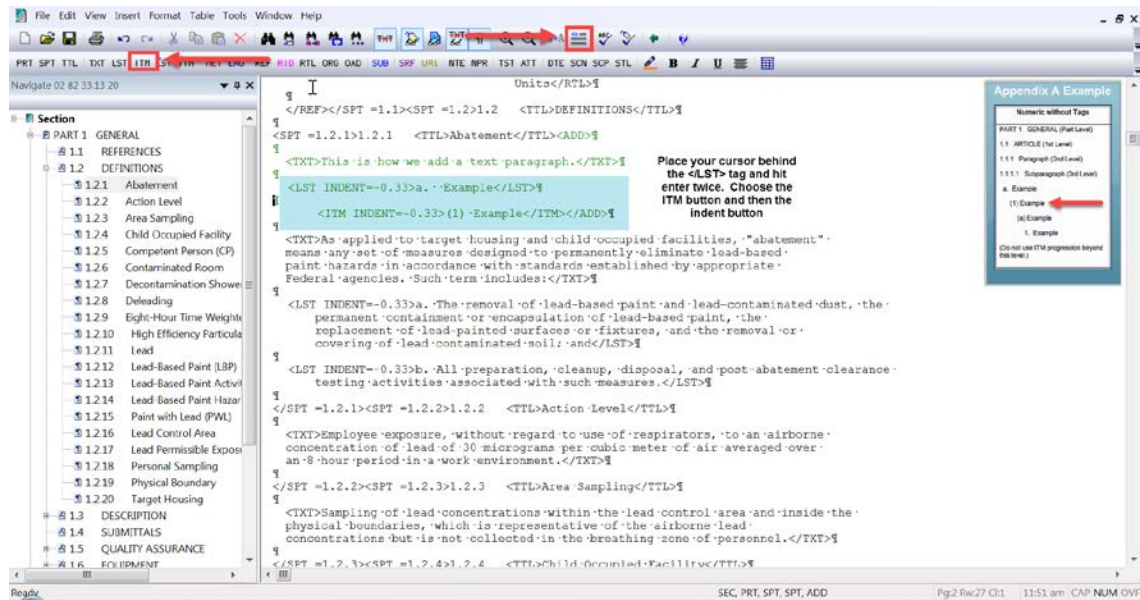
For this exercise, we will use the example specified in the UFC 1-300-02, Appendix A to create a four-tiered multileveled list. Then we are going to focus on the proper method for deleting these elements.



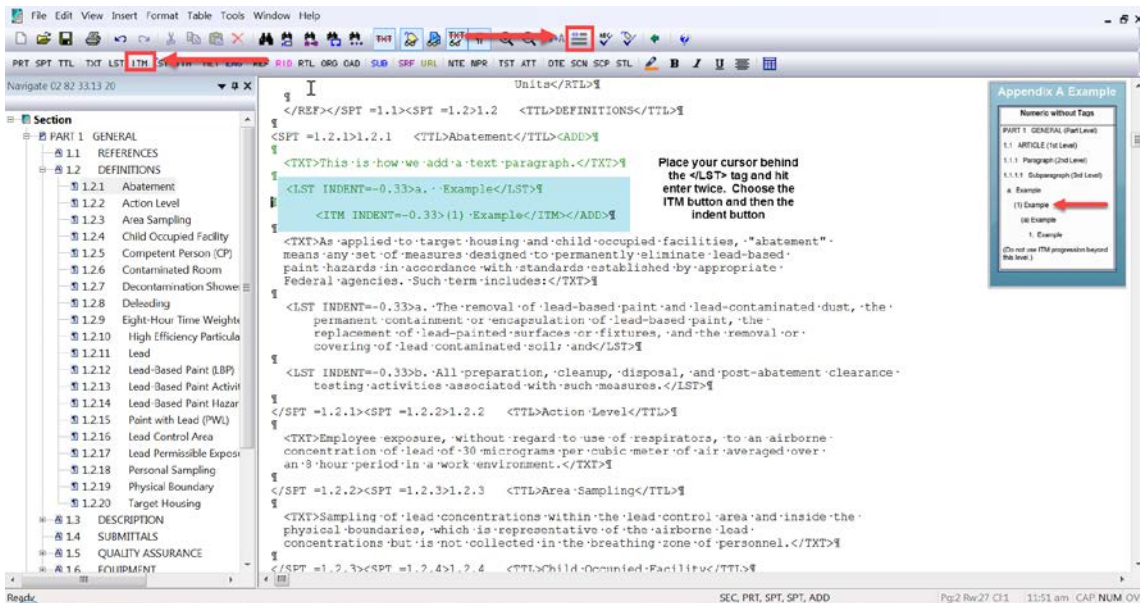
To continue, our cursor should still be at the end of the sentence we just typed. We need to *press the right-arrow key once* to move the cursor outside of the <TXT> tags, but making sure to stay within the <ADD> tags. Now let's *press the enter key twice* to add the additional hard returns we need in order to maintain the required double-spacing. Following our example in order to insert the first level, let's *press the LST button* on the Tagsbar. Since we need an outdent, we are going to *press the Toggle indentation button* on the SI Editor's Toolbar. As you will see this changed the LST tag to a <LST Indent =-0.33> tag.



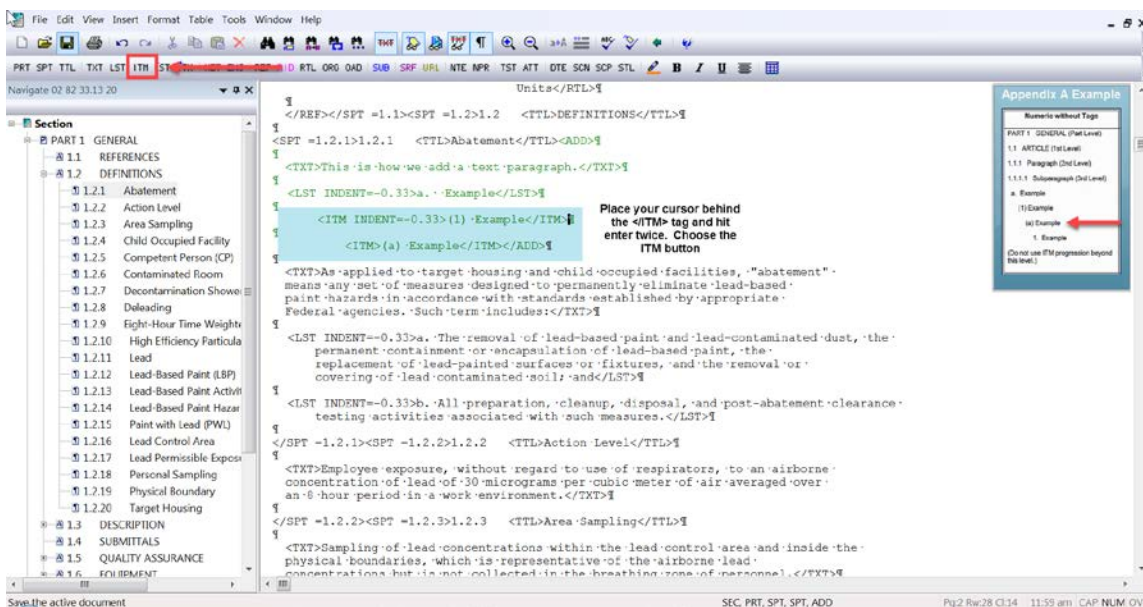
Regardless of the level we add, you want to make sure there is a combination of four characters and spaces before you text begins in order for the text to wrap properly. Since the first level is a lowercase "a." let's go ahead and type an "a., followed by two spaces, and Example".



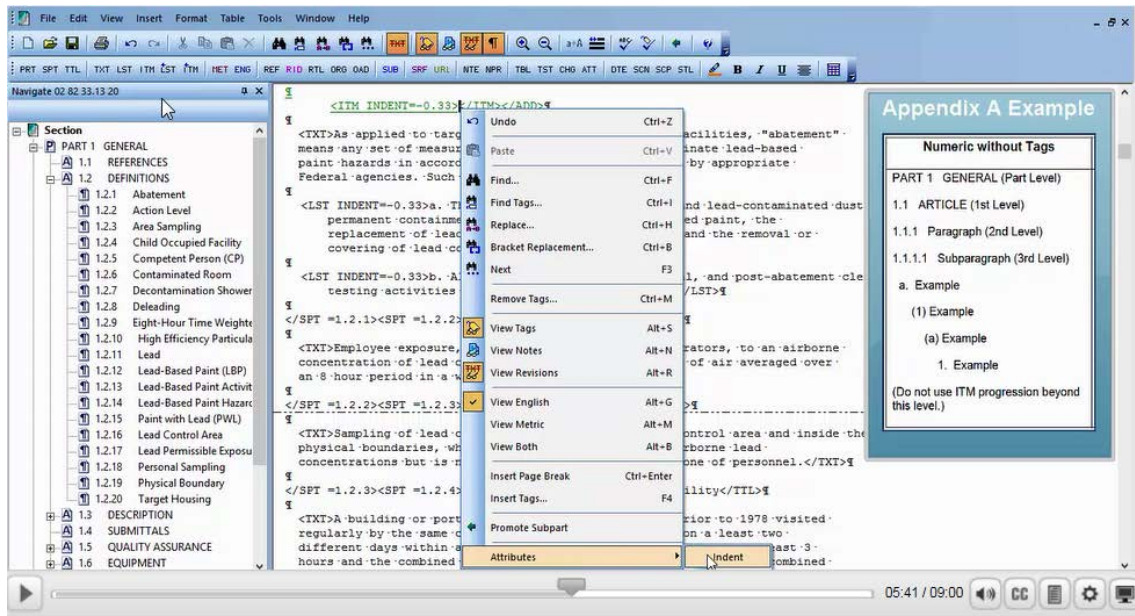
Now we are ready to insert the second level, *press the keyboard right arrow key once* to move the cursor outside of the LST tags, so we remain within the same set of ADD tags, in order to keep our markup as orderly as possible. Now *press the Enter key twice*, and then *select the ITM button* on the Tagsbar. Just as the first level above, we want to *press the Toggle Indentation button* to create a hanging indent. As shown in our example, the second level is a number 1 surrounded by a set of parenthesis, so let's go ahead and type this in. Remember in order for the text to wrap properly, we need to make sure there are exactly a total of four characters and spaces before the text begins. Since we have already used three spaces with the text we have already entered, we only need to add one more space. Let's go ahead and *add the space followed by Example*.



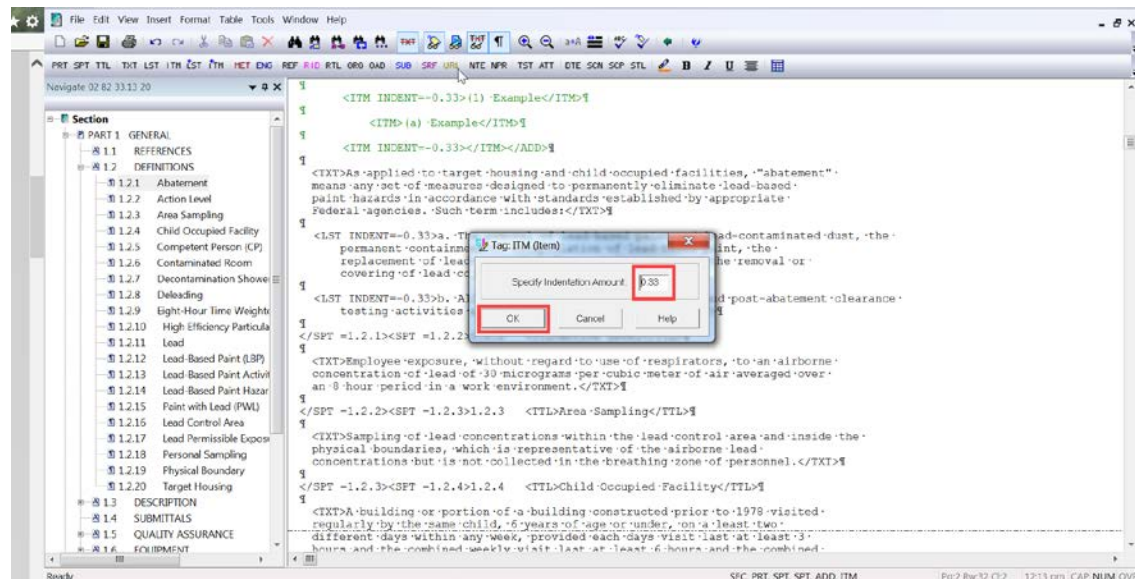
Use the *right-arrow key* to move the *cursor outside* of the ending *</ITM>* tags, and *press the enter key twice*. For the third level we are not going to use the outdent so we will *select the ITM button* on the Tagsbar, *type a lower case "a" surrounded by a set of parentheses*, *add a space*, and *type Example*.



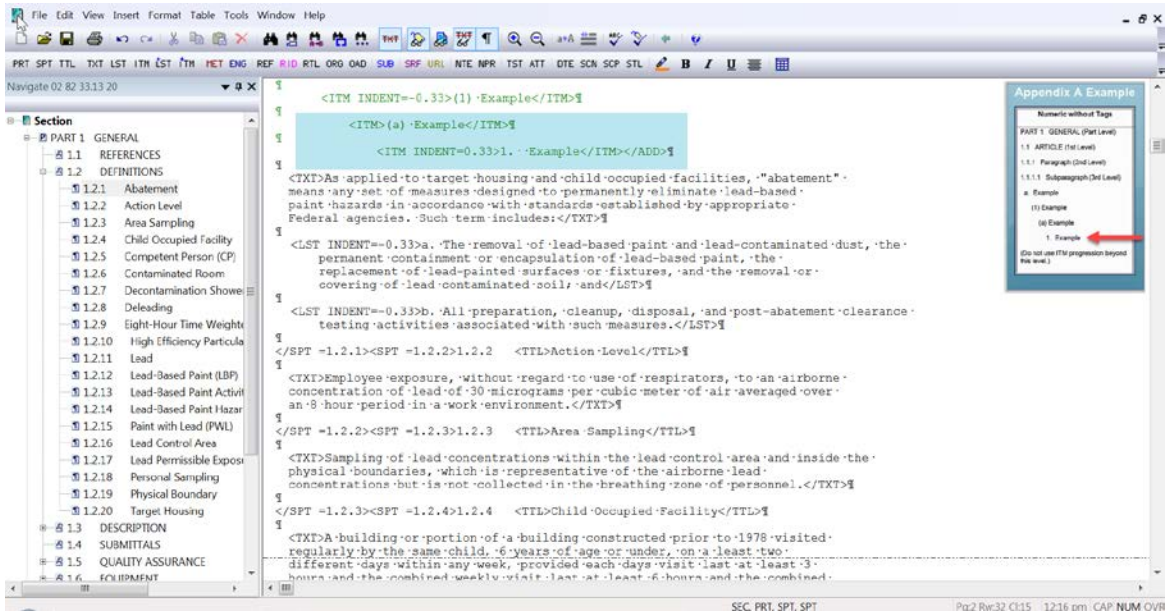
Now let's press the **right-arrow key** once to move outside of the *cursor* outside of the ending `</ITM>` tags, and press the **enter key** twice. We are now in position to add the last level. This time, we are going modify the tag attribute so we can change the indentation amount from a negative number to a positive number. Let's select the **ITM** button on the Tagsbar, and then select the **Toggle Indentation** button. With our *cursor* positioned to the right of the `<ITM INDENT=-0.33>` tag, let's right-click, select **Attributes**, and then choose **Indent**.



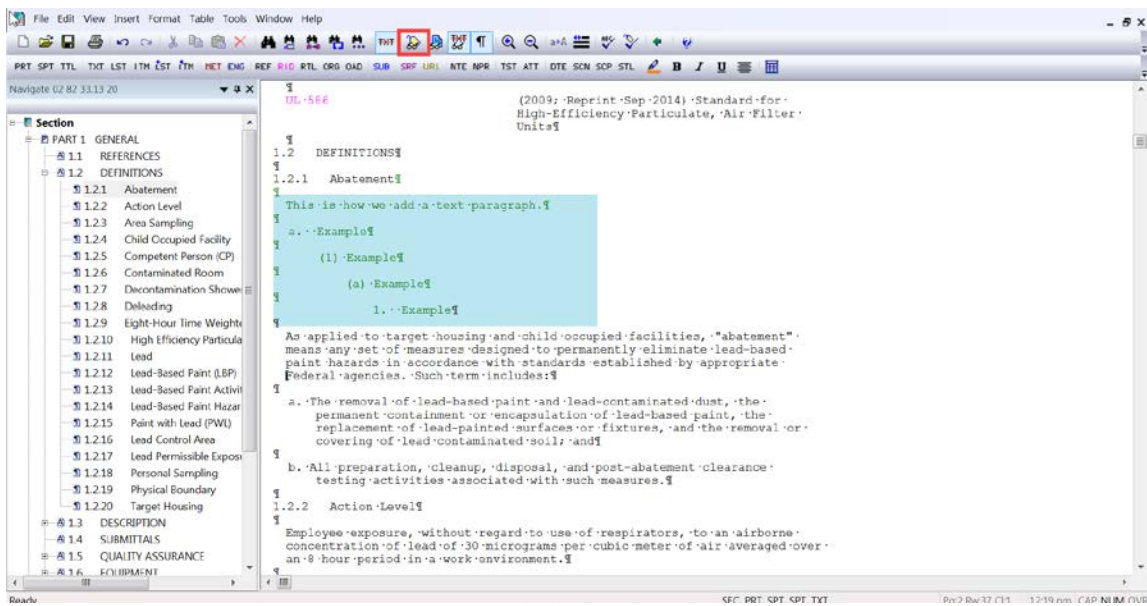
Now we want to change the Indentation Amount from **-0.33** to **0.33** by removing the minus, now let's select **OK**.



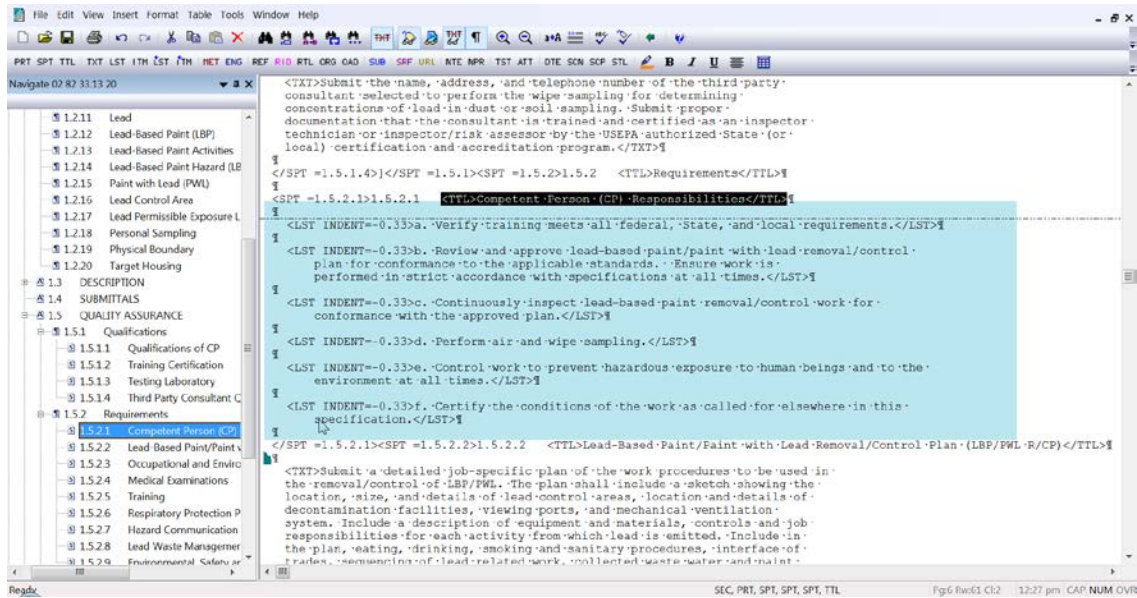
Now we can type "1." followed by two spaces and **Example**. Although you will typically not have to insert multileveled lists that use that many levels, it is still good information to know!



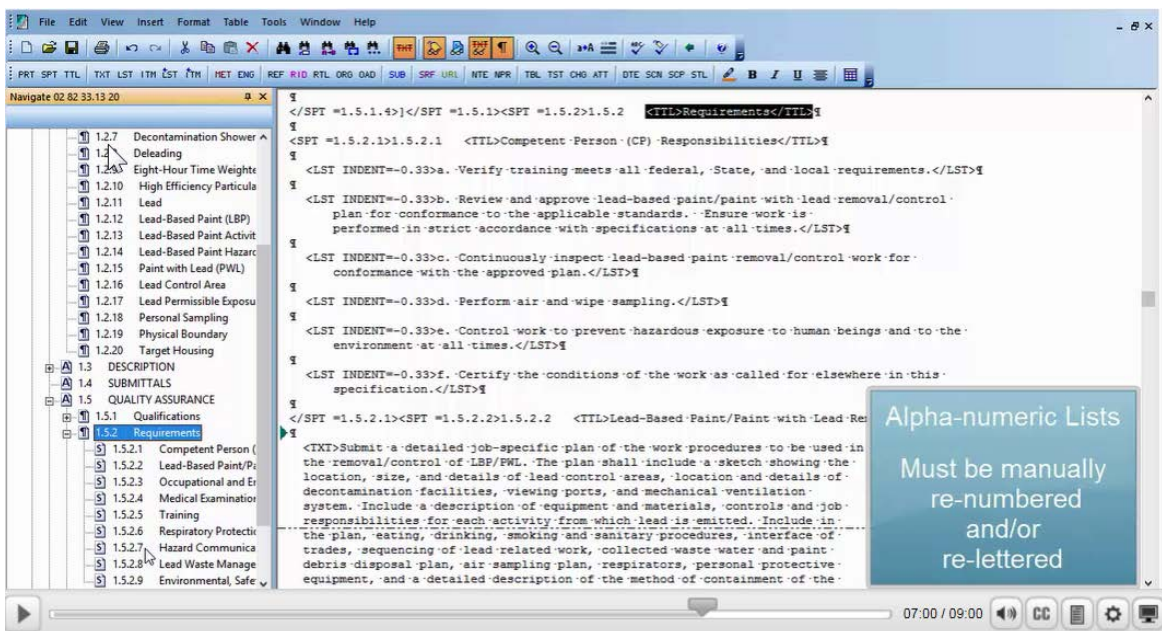
If we scroll up, and then we hide our tags, you will see how well this is formatted.



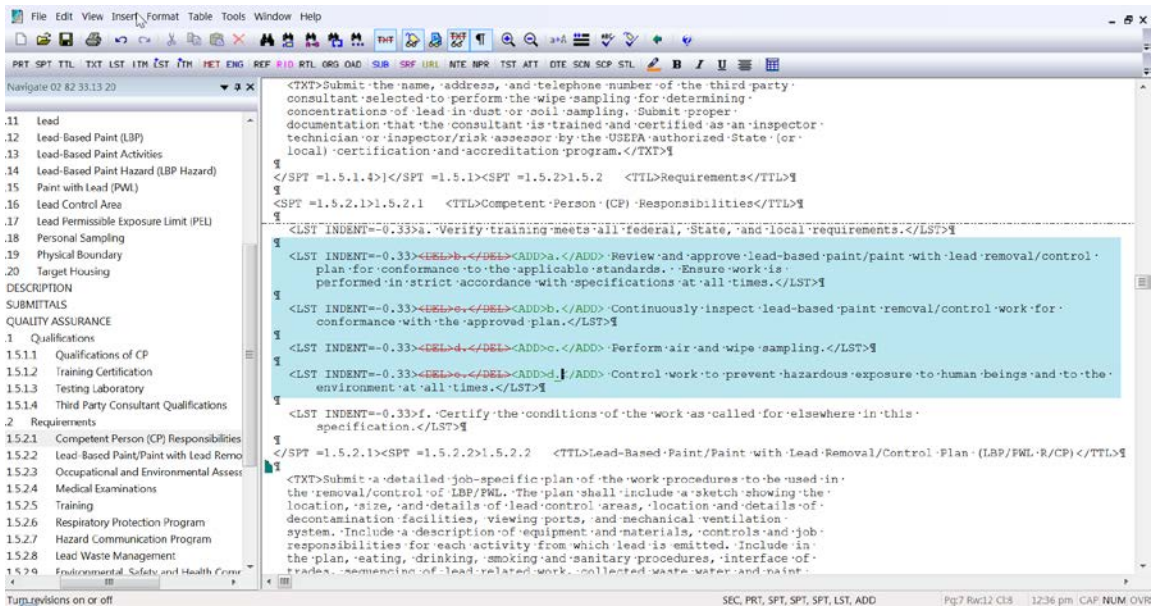
Now let's turn our tags back on in order to proceed. Now that you have mastered adding TXT, LST, and ITMS, it's time we focus on the proper methods used for deleting them. We are going to focus on learning the most efficient way to remove these elements, including List and Item indents. Learning to edit these elements correctly will avoid leaving unnecessary hard returns which cause gaps of empty space when the Revisions are not visible or have been executed. Let's *navigate* to 1.5.2 Requirements.



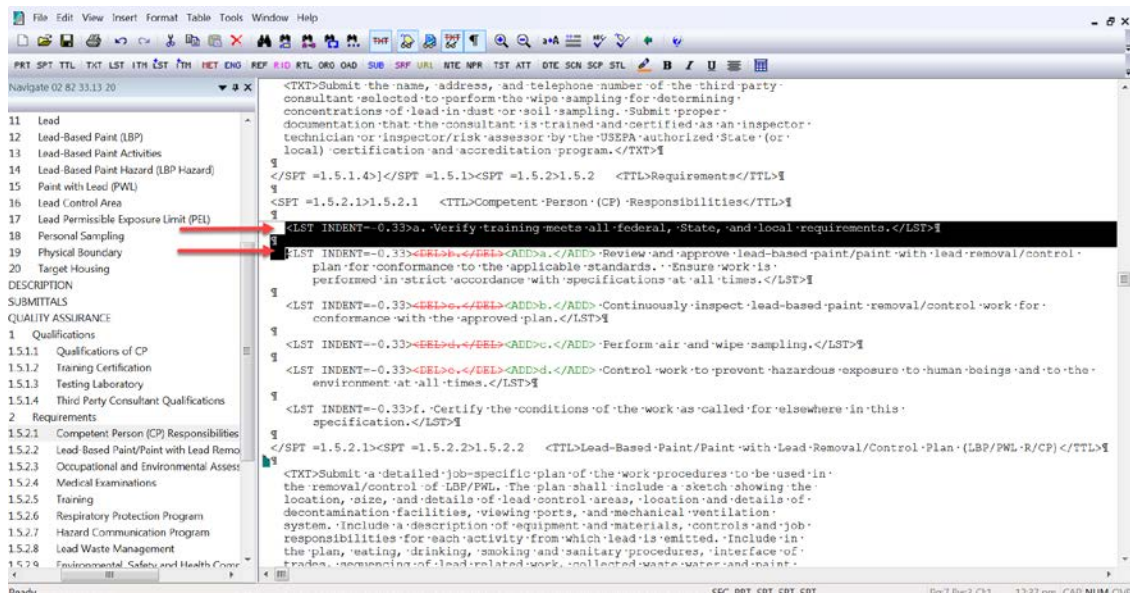
As you see, we have an ordered list using the LST Indent tags that are lettered a through f. These particular elements will not automatically re-letter or re-number and must be done manually. Due to the margin settings for these elements along with using revisions it is best to re-letter the list first, then delete the ones you do not need.



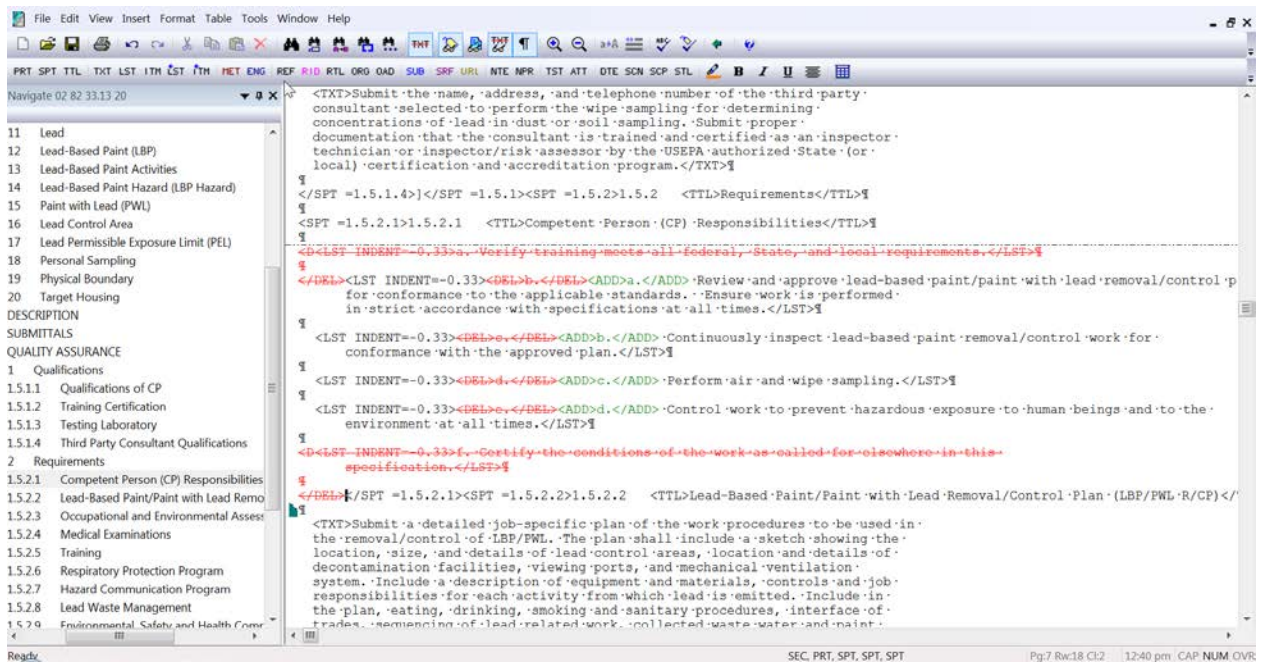
For this demonstration, we want to delete a and f. That means that we need to manually re-letter b through e. Let's start by *changing the b. to a.* so let's **highlight b.** and **type a.** Now let's do the same for c, d, and e. The trick to editing these elements is to start highlighting the tagged element you want to delete, stopping in front of the tagged element you want to keep. This technique works regardless if you are deleting TXT, LST, or ITM.



Let's *place our cursor* to the left of the `<LST INDEnt=-0.33>` tag for "a". Now we're going to *highlight*, and stop in front of the `LST INDEnt=-0.33>` tag for the new "a",



now press the DEL key. Deleting 'f' is a little different since it is at the end of the Subpart.
